

# Frequently asked

**SINGLE-TABLE EXPANDED SATELLITE SCHEDULE:** Twice daily: 7:00 AM-10:30 AM; and 4:00 PM until midnight. Special pre-event satellites one day only: start at 4:00 PM on Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

**HOW MANY CHIPS DO YOU START WITH?** Blinds, limits, antes always progress at a very moderate pace, and rounds are 30 minutes. \$200 buy-in starts with 3,000 in chips; \$300 buy-in starts with 5,000 in chips; \$500 buy-in with 10,000 in chips.

**CAN I SIGN UP OVER THE PHONE OR SEND YOU A CHECK?** Signups are in-person only. But, you can have someone else sign you up. A cash machine is available nearby on the casino floor and check cashing at the cage.

**CAN I SIGN UP FOR MORE THAN ONE TOURNAMENT AT A TIME?**

Yes, if you do you won't need to worry about being stuck in any lines. Otherwise, you should sign up as early as possible on the day of the tournament.

**SIGN-UP SCHEDULE:** Starts Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup> from 12 noon to 8 PM; then Wednesday November 4<sup>th</sup> until Sunday, November 15: from 9 AM to 9 PM, daily.

**WHAT TIME DO EVENTS START?** Most daytime events start at noon, with these exceptions: Seniors start at 10:30 AM, Ladies start at 2:30 PM, and the very last event #13 on Sunday, November 15 starts at 10:30 AM. Both Super satellites start at 6:30 PM.

**WHAT IF I DRIVE ALL THAT WAY AND YOU ARE SOLD OUT?** If you make the effort to get here we will make the effort to find a way that you get to play, and we never shut anyone out who is here on time. We can handle 720 players. If more than 720 players, we will make alternates.

**WHAT IF I SIGN UP FOR A TOURNAMENT AND THEN WIN A SATELLITE?** You can either sell the satellite winner receipt to another player, or get your buy-in back, but from the tournament cashier, only. Satellites never return cash.

**HOW MANY PLACES DO YOU PAY?** Roughly, 9% of the field, with a maximum of six tables paid.

**HOW LONG DO THE ONE-DAY TOURNAMENTS LAST?** Like most other major one-day tournaments, around 12 hours in terms of actual length, but that includes regular breaks as well as an hour dinner break. 10 hours of playing time is normal.

**HOW LONG DOES THE \$500 BUY-IN TOURNAMENT LAST?** This is a two-day event starting with 10,000 in chips. The first day, Saturday, November 14<sup>th</sup> should last no more than 10 hours or two tables, whichever comes first. Play resumes the next day, Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup> at 11 AM.

**HOW MANY LIVE ACTION GAMES DO YOU USUALLY GET?** Lots. We can accommodate up to 32 live tables. Realistically, we fill them all on weekends. Smallest limits are \$4-\$8; but we spread many more from \$10-\$20 through \$30-\$60; Omaha at \$4-8 and \$10-\$20; pot limit and no limit with buy-ins of \$200 to \$800 for \$2-\$5 blinds; \$500 to \$2,000 for \$5-\$10 blinds.

**SEMINAR:** Prior to the ladies tournament there will be a free poker seminar with Linda Johnson and Jan Fisher at 1:00 PM on Tuesday, November 10<sup>th</sup> open to anybody
