John Németh, 2008 New Blues Artist of the Year Nominee, Offers One Show Only Appearance at Wildfire Cabaret, April 29

One hot show with the audience hungry for more is exactly what's in store for blues fans at the Wildfire Cabaret House of Native Blues at Wildhorse Resort & Casino, April 29, 7-8:30 p.m.



John Németh, one of the hottest blues singers in the country, will heat up the Wildfire stage in an exclusive one performance only appearance. Tickets will be available at the door for \$20 each. Open seating is limited to 120 people. Doors open at 6 p.m.

Németh, a nominee for the 2008 New Blues Artist of the Year Award and harmonica playing native of Boise, ID, ranks as one of the hottest blues singers in the country. His sincere expression of emotion and his powerful voice have fans and critics alike asking, "Where did he get such a soulful vocal quality and style?" In a recent telephone interview, he said, "I've got so many influences. I soak up pretty much anything I listen to—it gets trapped in my brain and comes out in my songs. There are a whole lot of people I draw from: B.B. King, Junior Wells, Little Willie John, Little Milton, Nat King Cole, Willie Nelson, Frank Sinatra, Otis Redding, and those Stax guys."

Németh began singing in church as a child, then played in local bands as a teenager. In 1992, at the ripe old age of 16, he discovered the blues. "I got started with a good bunch of young players, and our shows were well-received. I played college bars and breweries, restaurants, parks, weddings, pizza parlors, and river-rafting events. It was a great scene to be a part of early on. I was able to get a lot of experience by playing the music I wanted to play, straight blues all night long."

In 2002, Németh joined Junior Watson and toured the United States, Canada and Asia. Now living in San Francisco, he tours with Anson Funderburgh and the Rockets, and he recently signed with Blind Pig Records for a multi-record agreement.
